Eleven African nations are highlighted in a major annual report on human rights as places where violations of citizens' rights were accompanied by insurgencies, domestic conflict or inter-communal violence. The nations, range from Libya in the north, Nigeria in the west, through Central Africa and the Great Lakes region to Somalia in the east, and Mozambique and Zimbabwe in the south.

Besides world violence, not a day goes by without a report of abuse of human rights taking place in some part of Africa. We hear about abuses in Zimbabwe, where the regime of Mnangagwa appears to be worse than that of Mugabe, activities of ISIS in Mozambique, child kidnappings by Boko Haram in Nigeria and gender-based violence in our own country.
